

According to the World Health Organisation (WHO), there are some 150 million circumcised women and girls worldwide. FGM doesn't only occur in the countries of Africa, but on a global scale. About 50,000 survivors of female genital mutilation live here in Germany!

These women are normally deeply traumatized from the FGM experience, which have a lifelong effect on them. It may lead to severe inflammation of the genital area, incontinence, urinary and fistula problems which in turn can result in isolation within their society and an unbearable feeling of shame. WHO estimates that 10% of all FGM cases die due to the procedure.

Since September 2013, women who underwent FGM continue to receive medical treatment and psychosocial help at Krankenhaus Waldfriede. Our multidisciplinary team is composed of staff members from Waldfriede's Network, as well as external cooperation partners.

In this flyer you will find all the parties involved and also the services that we offer at DFC. For first time contact (also anonymous), our medical coordinator, senior physician Dr. Cornelia Strunz, is available at all times. What we offer

On September 11, 2013, the Desert Flower Center Waldfriede (DFC) was launched in order to give back some quality of life to women suffering from FGM. In cooperation with the Vienna-based Desert Flower Foundation, the clinic attends to the problems of circumcised women using a holistic approach. To date, the treatment concept developed for this purpose is proving to be very effective.

Besides the highly specialised pelvic floor surgeons, DFC Waldfriede involves the services of a number of psychologists, counselors, social workers and support groups who stand behind the women's on-going or complementary treatment. Thanks to the hospital's longstanding focus on colorectal and pelvic floor surgery, women suffering from incontinence due to circumcision can receive highly specialised surgery. In addition to this, the team on-site is supported by a cooperating partner in plastic surgery and urology.

The Hospital Waldfriede regularly offers training in the medical and psychosocial Hospital treatment of FGM victims and is actively engaged in education and prevention.

In 2016, the team was awarded the Louise-Schroeder-Medal by the Berlin House of Representatives.







The patroness

The patroness of the **Desert Flower Center Waldfriede** is former model and UN Special Ambassador Waris Dirie [10]. She has advocated the rights of African women and fights against the ritual of female genital mutilation with her Desert Flower Foundation since 2002.

Medical director

The head of the Desert Flower Center Waldfriede is chief surgeon Dr. med. Roland Scherer. The nationally and internationally renowned coloproctologist has been dealing with the issue of FGM for many years.

The costs

For women with German health insurance, the treatment costs will be fully covered by German national and private health insurance companies. For women and girls who have undergone FGM and do not have means to allow for surgery we try to find financial support.

Financing

The Förderverein Waldfriede e.V., which was founded in 2013, raises funds for medical and psychosocial treatment. To guarantee ongoing financial coverage of the services in the Desert Flower Center Waldfriede, donations are always welcome.
